In early November, Connie Dejak, President and CEO of Runnymede Healthcare Centre (RHC), invited us to reflect on the significance of Remembrance Day with RHC patients, many of whom served during our country's time of need. On hand were The Queen's Own Rifles, Canada's oldest continuous infantry regiment, who began the event by marching into the hospital adorned in 1860s uniform to the buglers playing the skirmishers call. The bugle band then performed the "Last Post" followed by a reading of In Flanders Fields by special guest The Honourable Sarmite D. Bulte, P.C., who recited the famous poem to an emotional audience.
